




The PRF69 contract provides a wide-ranging array of engineering services.



PRF69 Project Examples



A few projects completed by PRF69 vendors:

- Preliminary and final design of the Magazine Street Pedestrian Bridge in Cambridge
- Design, engineering, and consulting services to evaluate condition of four outdoor pool facilities in Chicopee, including evaluation of the facilities, water use/loss data, filtration systems, and hazardous materials assessment and abatement plans
- Preparation of a rehabilitation plan for Gallops Island, which had been closed to the public due to asbestos and other contaminants
- Construction administration services, such as construction management, shop drawing review, change order support, and assistance with regulatory agencies
- Feasibility study and design, environmental permitting, and construction supervision for the Hathaway Dam removal in Pittsfield.

Engaging Vendors: Quotes & Pricing

- Statement of Work (SOW) based; Sample SOW available on the Master Contract Record in COMMBUYS.
- Hourly and other rates for each vendor on the Master Contract Record
- Quoting Requirements: Projects with an estimated value of \$10,000+ require at least three quotes. Large projects: Recommended to seek quotes from all vendors in the applicable Category and Geographic area.*



PRF76 Overview





The <u>PRF76</u> contract provides Management Consulting, Program Coordinating and Planning Services to the Commonwealth and its Eligible Entities.

- Current term: October 1, 2022 September 30, 2027
- Nine contract categories
- 110 current vendors across categories



Contract Categories • Category 2: Program Development, Organizational and Strategic Planning Services

Category 3: Professional Development Services

Category 4: General Data Analytics Services and Evaluation Services

• Category 5: Downtown/Town Center/Commercial Area Revitalization Consulting Services

• Category 6: Planning, Zoning and Development Consulting Services

Category 7: DESE Facilities Technical Assistance Services and Operations

Category 8: Health and Human Services

• Category 9: Specialized Racial and Health Equity Services

Category 1: Education Services

- Educational leadership evaluation, development, coaching, and interim leadership services
- Curriculum, performance, and achievement frameworks/standards protocols
- Project management for school/district performance reviews or assistance services
- Act as School Turnaround Operators offering statewide education improvement services to manage and operate low-performing, underperforming, and chronically underperforming schools
- Development of online curriculum/instruction/assessment content for pre-k to 12 students and adults and for teachers and/or administrators of pre-k to 12 students and adults
- Administration and operation of special education departments and programs





- Administrative, human resource, engineering, personnel, and physical distribution management
- Scientific administration; economics; education; labor; health and social services
- Budget analysis, market analysis and projections in business development, economic forecasting, development of funding formulas and total cost analysis

Restriction for this category includes Financial Audit services currently provided under the PRF78 Audit, Accounting, Compliance, Revenue Enhancement Services Statewide Contract

Category 3: Professional Development Services





- Leadership Development Programs
- Team building/ Capacity Building Programs
- Coaching Programs
- Change Management Programs
- Communication Skills Programs
- Customer Relationship Management Programs
- Business Process Redesign Programs
- Executive searches for Head of Commonwealth Agencies

Not covered under this category is professional development for **specialized** public safety, law enforcement, fire, healthcare, mental health, highway, environmental, legal, food preparation or Information Technology Training.

Category 4: General Data Analytics Services and Evaluation Services





Primarily a research category covering:

- Survey research, including data collection, analysis and development of needs assessment
- Forecasting analytic techniques
- Qualitative analysis and mixed method of analysis
- Preparing and analyzing large data, comparative and cost-effective studies
- Preparing and using electronic data for quality improvement work, service utilization, comparative effectiveness
- Expertise geo-spatial analysis

Exclusions: This category is intended to cover general data analytics and/ or evaluation services for the Commonwealth; it is not intended to cover specialized healthcare and health safety consulting related services.

Category 5: Downtown/Town Center/Commercial Area Revitalization Consulting Services



Provide technical assistance related consultant services related to:

- Downtown/Town Center/Commercial Area development in the areas of Business Development
- Business District Management
- Climate Impacts
- Cultural and Arts Development and Management
- District Branding and Management
- Planning for Housing/ Housing Development
- Quality of Life Homeless Services, Addiction Services, Mental Health & Wellness
- Technical Assistance related to Downtown Revitalization: Tourism Development; Traffic Engineering and Design; Transportation Planning
- Urban Design/Architectural Services; Wayfinding; Zoning and Land Use related to Downtown/Town Center/Commercial Area Revitalization

Category 6: Planning, Zoning and Development Consulting Services

- Technical assistance in the context of a workshop(s) and/or on-site technical assistance
- Guide the community through a visioning exercise to identify the desired future for the community
- Train the community in conducting an assets and liabilities review
- Guidance on commercial, downtown and revitalization
- Guidance on how communities can analyze their upper story potential
- Advice and guidance on a broad range of housing opportunities and gaps
- Transportation Consulting Services
- Zoning Technical Services
- Geographic Information System (GIS) Services



Category 7: DESE Facilities Technical Assistance Services and Operations

Provide technical assistance and training to public educational entities (public school districts, individual public schools, public universities) to maximize safety in school facilities, supplemental facilities, and grounds to enable continuous full-time in-person schooling.

- DESE is administering a federal COVID relief program that requires the state to provide services via Statewide Contract to eligible private schools
- Category expanded to include private schools participating in the Massachusetts Emergency Assistance to Non-public Schools program (EANS-I or EANS-II)
- Fiscal intermediary processing fee of 2.5% to be assumed by the vendor



Category 8: Health and Human Services



- Public Health Services
- Mental Health Services
- Developmental Services
- Employment Services
- Child Service organizations
- Emergency Preparedness
- Financial Services
- Integrated human services that aid communities, families and individuals in a faster and cost-effective way to self-sufficiency

Direct services to clients are not covered.



Category 9: Specialized Racial and Health Equity Services



Development of policies and technical assistance to address institutional and structural inequities through change management; project and program development, and strategic planning using a racial equity framework. Projects include:

- Hiring and retention
- Evaluation, Technical Assistance (TA), and Capacity Building around Culturally and Linguistically Appropriate Services (CLAS)
- Training and TA around strategies to engage:
 - Black, Indigenous, and People of Color (BIPOC); Latinx individuals; Individuals who do not speak English or who prefer to speak in another language; Individuals who do not have access to transportation, either personal or public, or who face barriers getting to a vaccination location; Individuals with disabilities and those who have access and functional needs; Individuals experiencing homelessness; Individuals with mental illness and/or residents with substance use disorder; Individuals who identify as LGBTQ+

PRF76 Pricing and Quote Requirements



- This is a fee for service contract
- Engagements that are limited in scope, time and value might be best quoted on hourly rate compensation structure
- Purchases made through this contract will be direct, outright purchases: there are no predetermined price files
- The compensation structure is according to individual projects as described and agreed to in the SoW and the accepted bidder response
- Final prices may be negotiated between the vendor and the hiring department
- Engagements valued at less than \$10,000 require at least one quote or an accepted Statement of Work with an estimated value
- Engagements valued to exceed \$10,000 require buyers to solicit at least three written quotes


